**Just Pay, Just Peace? Economic Considerations in the
Concept of Just Peace**

Dr. Christian Göbel
Assumption University, USA

Dr. Christian Göbel is Professor of Philosophy at Assumption University in Worcester, MA, USA, and Visiting Professor of Ethics at the German Armed Forces Command and General Staff College in Hamburg, Germany.

Dr. Göbel has held positions and visiting positions in Italy/Vatican City, Germany, India, and the USA, and served as a Research Associate at the Von Hügel Institute, Cambridge University, UK (2014-19). At Assumption University, he directed the Rome Program, the Ecumenical Institute, and served as D'Alzon Chair (2019-23).

A native of Germany, Dr. Göbel completed his undergraduate studies in Paderborn and Munich and pursued graduate studies in Italy, the UK, and the Netherlands. He holds degrees in philosophy (Ph.L., Ph.D.) and theology (M.Phil., Ph.D.) from the Benedictine University of Sant'Anselmo in Rome, Cambridge University, and Leiden University. He has published widely (eight books and over 100 other scholarly publications) on topics ranging from the Hellenistic Schools (philosophy as a way of life) to Anselm of Canterbury, the philosophy of religion, and military ethics. Dr. Göbel also serves as a Lieutenant Colonel in the German Army Reserve.

Abstract: Some ethicists view the Ukraine War and the escalation in the Middle East as confirmation of their darkest fears: that a return to political realism may bring an end to the long-standing hope for a global peace and security architecture. Others have revived Just War Theory (JWT) to defend the morally justified use of military force. I find both responses overly pessimistic. Just Peace Theory (JPT) – which, inspired by Immanuel Kant and Christian teachings, had partly supplanted Just War Theory in the last decades, especially since the fall of the Iron Curtain – still has its merits. While both JWT and JPT share principles regarding the justified use of law-preserving violence, JPT adopts a broader perspective: it is guided by the vision of a peaceful world grounded in just conditions for all. Its goal is to address the root causes of war, including political, social, ecological, and economic injustice.

My lecture will explore how leading strands of JPT propose to achieve this goal. The emergence of a multipolar world should not deter efforts to strengthen a cooperative international order that is foundational to the vision of just peace. At the same time, key tenets of JPT must be reexamined. Economic justice, for example, entails far more than the well-known principle of “change through trade” that is sometimes associated with Kant. A philosophical look at some economic considerations within the concept of just peace will therefore be a central focus of my lecture.

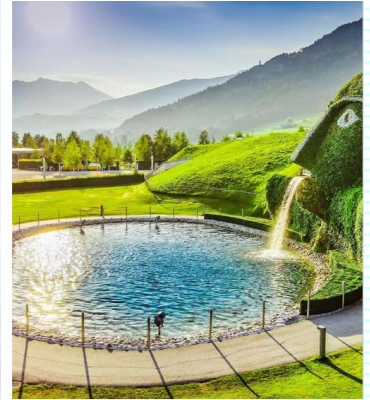

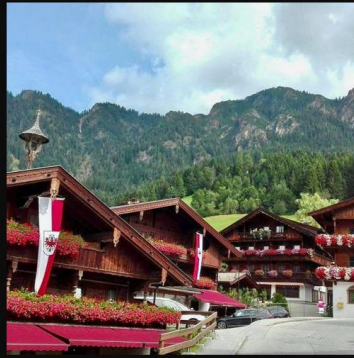

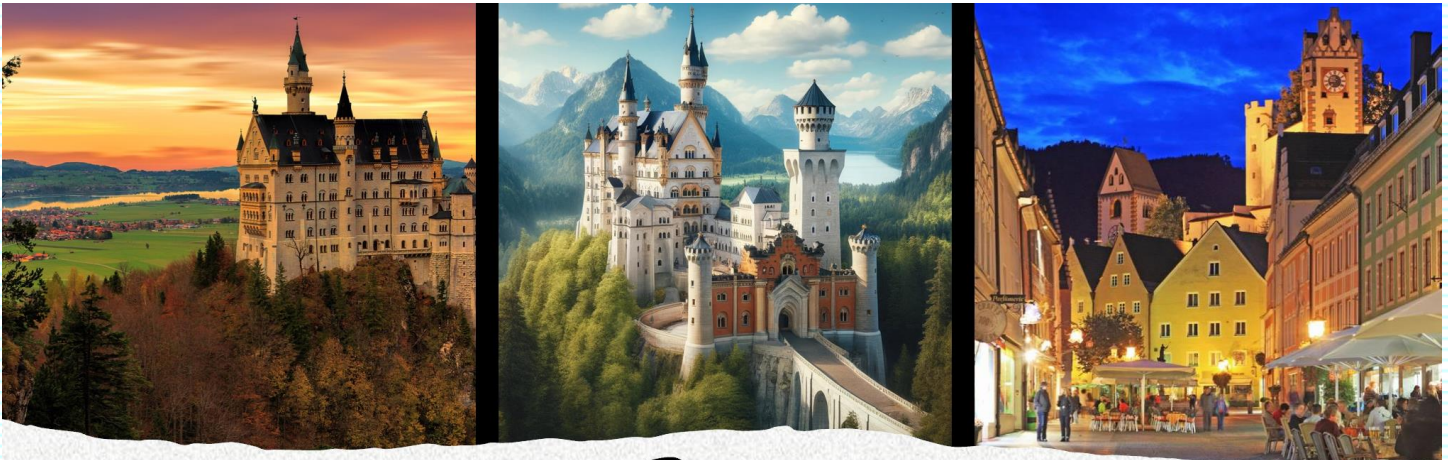
